ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Goal of the Program

The Program will focus on three things:

The material will be sufficient to cover Current Affairs completely, and any additional sources or newspaper reading will **NOT** be required. Apart from that candidates may be required to write answers in the classroom for practice.

Phases of the Current Affairs Program

The Current Affairs Program by ForumIAS will commence from 09 Sept. 2023. It is conducted in 3 phases.

- **Phase 1:** Issue wise Coverage of Contemporary Issues of GS Paper 2 & Paper 3. In this phase, 2 classes will be held in a week. They cover both Prelims & Mains Centric Issues which have been in news. The Phase 1 ends with a break of 4-6 weeks, after which Phase 2 commences.
- **Phase 2:** In this Phase, the focus changes from Mains to Prelims completely. Classes are held 2-3 days in a week about 2-3 months before the Prelims. Phase 2 follows Phase 1 with a 4 - 6 week break.
- **Phase 3:** Phase 3 commences about 2 weeks after the Prelims, and issues covered are completely from that year's Mains Perspective. Classes resume on a weekly basis. As the program comes to an end there is a steady & revision break for two weeks subsequently regular classes will be held 3 days in a week for completion of the course. Just like Prelims, the last classes are held about the 1 month before the Mains Examination and are conducted on Weekdays and not on Weekends.

Classroom students of ForumIAS Current Affairs Class have consistently secured the highest marks in General Studies (GS) for the past six years. 


