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About Optional Answer Writing Focus Group (O-AWFG)

Optional Answer Writing Focus Group is an **answer writing program for Optional Subjects**. It will comprise of **daily answer writing tests** as well as **full length tests**.

The O-AWFG seeks to precisely solve four problems for the students:

- 1. a regular committed time for preparation of Optional for mains 2024.
- 2. to provide for incremental study plan on day day basis.
- 3. to cover important and relevant PYQs as there has been trend from UPSC to repeat questions in optional.
- 4. to solve the hurdle of answer writing for optional.

What is the scheme of the program?

The program will start from 1st July 2024. It will comprise of three (3) components:

1. Daily Answer Writing Tests: Mini Test comprising 3 – 5 questions will be provided. These will be conducted 4 times a week on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. Out of 3 – 5 questions provided **2 will be graded** while other **3 will be for your self-assessment**. There will be **28 tests in** this segment.

You will also be provided discussion and solution for these questions.

These tests will also comprise of PYQ questions.

Each optional Paper is divided into 4 parts. Paper 1 in 2 parts and Paper 2 in 2 parts. Each part will be having around 6 – 7 tests.

- 2. Full Length Tests: As said above each optional Paper is divided into 4 parts. Paper 1 in 2 parts and Paper 2 in 2 parts. Each part will be having around 6 7 tests. Post completion of each part we will be conducting a full-length sectional test. After completion of all the daily tests we will have 1 full length paper each on Paper 1 and Paper 2. So, in total we will be having 4 Full length Sectional paper and 2 Full Length paper. You will be provided detailed evaluation on the same. You will also receive solution and test discussion on the same.
- **3. Mentorship**: You will be made available dedicated mentor whom you can meet throughout the program to understand feedback as well as help with anything related to your optional. The mentorship is available seamlessly in both online as well as offline mode.

Fees and Concessions:

The program fee is **Rs. 12,980/- (inclusive of all taxes)** for both online and offline students. The program is available at a concession of **25% for optional foundation students and GS foundation students**.
