- Theme = An Empowered Global South for a Sustainable Future
- 123 countries participated (China & Pakistan X)
- India: Global Development Compact" (GDC): reduce debt burden + Trade for development,
   Capacity building for sustainable growth, Technology sharing, Project specific concessional finance.
- Special fund = \$2.5 Mn for trade promotion.

### 32. News $\rightarrow$ Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative (IPOI) = 5 years.

- India initiative : EAS (2019) : Bangkok
- Based on 'Security and Growth for All in the Region (SAGAR)' vision of 2015.
- non-treaty-based voluntary arrangement.
- Pillars
  - Maritime Security
  - · Maritime Ecology
  - · Maritime Resources
  - Capacity Building and Resource Sharing
  - Disaster Risk Reduction and Management
  - Science, Technology, and Academic Cooperation1

• TAPI Pipeline = 1800 km : to transport natural gas from Galkynysh gas field in southeastern

Turkmenistan.

#### 34. News → World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS)

India participated: International Telecommunication Union's (ITU) WSIS+20 Forum High-Level
 Event 2024 in Geneva, Switzerland.

This Document is a part of ForumIAS Current Affairs Classes



- WSIS forum is co-organised annually by ITU, UNESCO, UNDP and UNCTAD and co-hosted by ITU and Swiss Confederation.
- Aim: Create multi- stakeholder platform to address issues raised by information and communication technologies through inclusive approach at national, regional and international levels.

## International Organizations / Bodies in news

- 1. News → UN Internal Justice Council: Madan B. Lokur: Chairperson for a four-year term.
- IJC = established by the UN General Assembly to promote independence, professionalism, and accountability within the UN's justice system.
- 5 persons in council: Appointment Process: Members are appointed by the UN Secretary-General.
   The Chairperson is selected by consensus among the other four members
- 2. News → UN Commission on Narcotic Drugs : India = chair ship: 68th UNCND
- Estb. by: 1946 resolution of United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC).
- HQ = Vienna, Austria
- primary policy-making body: drug-related issues + Monitors trends + implement conventions.
  - The 1961 Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs (amended in 1972)
  - The 1971 Convention on Psychotropic Substances
  - The 1988 UN Convention against Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances.
- Member States: 53 countries elected by ECOSOC
- News → Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS): withdrawal of Mali, Burkina
   Faso, and Niger.
- Treaty of Lagos +



- ECOWAS Commission + ECOWAS Parliament + ECOWAS Court of Justice
- 12 Members now
- News → United Nation General Assembly (UNGA): resolution on AI + resolution: admit Palestine in UN.
- Al resolution = promotion of safe, secure and trustworthy Al systems + capacity building and bridging digital divides.
- · Admission requires :
  - · Application to Secretary-General : state is accepting the UN Charter
  - UNSC: No P-5 should veto + 9 votes
  - UNGA: 2/3 majority
- · UNGA:
  - Establishment: 1945, under the UN Charter.
  - · Headquarters: New York, USA.
  - Membership: 193 member states (All UN member states are part of the UNGA).
  - Meetings: Annual General Debate (September) + special and emergency sessions.
  - One country, one vote principle.
  - Resolutions are non-binding but carry political significance.

Also: Pm addressed the 'Summit of the Future' at the United Nations headquarters in New York.

Theme = "Multilateral Solutions for a Better Tomorrow."

- News → UNSC : elected Denmark, Greece, Pakistan, Panama, and Somalia : non-permanent members. + Common pledge initiative + Russia vetoed resolution on a weapon-free outer space (proposed by US and Japan)
- UNSC = 15 member ( 5 Permanent : US, UK, FRC) + 10 (Non-permanent) : Regional distribution
- UNSC = International peace + sec. + binding decisions
- Common Pledge initiative : engage mediators, governments, and civil society to ensure women's full, equal, and meaningful engagement in peace processes.



- 6. News  $\rightarrow$  NATO : 75 years + Sweden = 32nd member.
- NATO = Pol + Military alliance : North Atlantic treaty (1949)
- HQ = Brussels, Belgium
- NATO + 5 = NATO + Australia, New Zealand, South Korea, Japan and Israel.
- Major Non-NATO Ally (MNNA) status: selective support
- 7. News → ICC prosecutor : arrest warrants : Israel's PM and Hamas leaders.
- 124 members of ICC : India = not member
- Founding document = Rome Statute (1998, 2002)
- · Binding decisions.

International Court of Justice (ICJ)	International Criminal Court (ICC)
Settles legal disputes between states. Provides advisory opinions on legal questions.	Prosecutes individuals for the gravest crimes of international concern.
Cases between countries regarding border disputes, treaty interpretations, etc.	Prosecutions of individuals for war crimes, genocide, etc.
UN Charter.	Rome Statute.
Principal judicial organ of the UN.	Independent, but has a cooperation agreement with the UN.
HQ: The Hague, Netherlands.	HQ : The Hague, Netherlands.

News → The Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS): upheld the decision to disqualify Vinesh
Phogat from the Paris Olympics.



- Established in 1984, CAS operates under the International Council of Arbitration for Sport (ICAS) and is based in Lausanne, Switzerland, with offices in Sydney and New York.
- Independent body: resolves sports-related disputes through arbitration and mediation.
- Legal Dispute Resolution: CAS resolves sports-related legal disputes, with decisions enforceable like court judgments.
- Mediation Services: CAS can help resolve disputes amicably through mediation when allowed.
- Special Tribunals: CAS sets up tribunals for major events (e.g., Olympics, Commonwealth Games)
   with event-specific rules.
- News → International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) : emergency meeting to discuss attacks
  on the Zaporizhzhia Nuclear Power Plant.
- Established in 1957 as the world's "Atoms for Peace" organization within the UN.
- Intergovernmental organization : seeks to promote the peaceful use of nuclear energy + inhibit its use for any military purpose, including nuclear weapons.
- Operates under Statute of the IAEA
- Reports to both the United Nations General Assembly and UN security council
- · Headquarter- Vienna, Austria.
- Implements comprehensive safeguards agreements mandated by the Nuclear Non-Proliferation
   Treaty (NPT).
- Signature and ratification of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) are not preconditions for IAEA membership. (178 members)
- 10. News → International Telecommunication Union (ITU): World Telecommunication

  Standardization Assembly (WTSA) 2024 was held in New Delhi (First time)
- Formed in 1865 as the International Telegraph Union.
- Specialized agency of the **United Nations** for digital technology and communication.
- 193 Member States and over 1,000 organizations, such as companies, universities, and regional bodies. (India ✓)
- Role:
  - Allocates global radio spectrum and satellite orbits.



- Sets technical standards for telecommunication and ICT.
- Promotes access to ICT in underserved communities worldwide.
- Headquarters: Geneva, Switzerland.

# 11. News → UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees : Israel banned UNRWA from operating in Israel and the Palestinian territories.

- Created by the UN General Assembly in 1949 to assist Palestinian refugees: Assistance to Palestinian refugees displaced after the 1948 Arab-Israeli conflict.
- · Operates in Gaza, the West Bank, Lebanon, Syria, and Jordan.
- Provides education, health, relief, social services, microfinance, and emergency assistance both inside and outside refugee camps.

## 12. News $\rightarrow$ 150th anniversary of the Universal Postal Union (UPU).

- Department of Posts issued commemorative stamps.
- United Nations specialized agency and the postal sector's primary forum for international cooperation in Global Postal Access and modernization of postal services.
- Established by the Treaty of Bern of 1874.
- It is the second oldest international organization worldwide, after the International
   Telecommunication Union (ITU), which was formed in 1865.

# 13. News → International Criminal Police Organisation (INTERPOL) : introduced its first Silver Notice + Blue Corner notice for Prajwal Revanna

- Interpol = Estb in 1923 as the International Criminal Police Commission in Vienna, Austria.
- 196 member countries (India )
- Highest decision-making body = General Assembly.
- Each country has an INTERPOL National Central Bureau (NCB): In India, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) serves as the designated NCB.
- Silver Notice = to assist nations in tracking and recovering criminally acquired assets such as properties, vehicles, and businesses: Launched at Italy's request.



# TYPES OF INTERPOL NOTICES



RED NOTICE: To seek the location and arrest of wanted persons with a view to extradition or similar lawful action.



YELLOW NOTICE: To help locate missing persons, often minors, or to help identify persons who are unable to identify themselves.



**BLUE NOTICE:** To collect additional information about a person's identity, location or activities in relation to a crime.



**BLACK NOTICE:** To seek information on unidentified bodies.



**GREEN NOTICE:** To provide warnings and intelligence about persons who have committed criminal offences and are likely to repeat these crimes in other countries.



**ORANGE NOTICE:** To warn of an event, a person, an object or a process representing a serious and imminent threat to public safety.



INTERPOL-UN SECURITY COUNCIL SPECIAL NOTICE: Issued for groups and individuals who are the targets of UN Security Council sanctions committees.



purple Notice: To seek or provide information on modus operandi, objects, devices and concealment methods used by criminals.

- UN agency focused on meteorology, operational hydrology, and related geophysical sciences.
- · HQ: Geneva + 193 Members
- Structure
  - World Meteorological Congress
  - Executive Council
  - Secretariat:

## 15. News $\rightarrow$ OPEC+ : Brazil's entry + decision to extend its deep oil output cuts in 2025.

- OPEC = Baghdad conference : Iran, Iraq, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, and Venezuela.
- Now OPEC = 12 countries: Iran, Iraq, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, Venezuela, Algeria, Congo,
   Equatorial Guinea, Gabon, Libya, Nigeria, and the United Arab Emirates



- OPEC+ = formed in 2016 = OPEC + Azerbaijan, Bahrain, Brunei, Brazil, Kazakhstan, Malaysia,
   Mexico, Oman, Russia, South Sudan and Sudan
- HQ= Vienna, Austria.

# 16. News → UN Peacekeepers (UNPK) + United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL)(alleged attack by Israel Defense Forces IDF)

- UNIFIL recently accused the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) of deliberately destroying an observation tower and the perimeter fence of a UN post in Marwahin.
- UNIFIL = UN peacekeeping mission created by the UN Security Council in 1978 following Israel's invasion of southern Lebanon
- India-led Group of Friends (GOF) launched a new database designed to record crimes against
   Peacekeepers
- UNPK helps maintain peace & security in conflict zones by deploying military, police, and civilian personnel.
- Started in 1948 in West Asia + deployed by the UN Security Council.
- The budget and resources : General Assembly approval + Members are obligated to pay.
- The Department of Peace Operations (DPO) of the UN provides political and executive direction to peacekeeping operations.

## 17. News → FATF's (Financial Action Task Force) Mutual Evaluation Report

- Financial Action Task Force (FATF) plenary in Singapore adopted the Mutual Evaluation Report (MER) of India.
- MER = Assesses country's measures to combat: Money laundering + Terrorist financing +
   proliferation of WMD: Peer-reviewed by FATF members.
- India now belongs to the prestigious 'regular follow-up' category ( with only four other G20 nations)
- FATF = 1989: 40 members (38 + GCC + European comm.)
- Black List / Grey list = high risk jurisdictions.



- News → Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice (CCPCJ): 33rd session concluded.
- Steps to combat Transnational Organised Crimes (TOC)
- Generation Justice (GenJust) initiative : engage youth in crime prevention and criminal justice.
- CCPJ = Under United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) : primary organ guiding the UN's activities in crime prevention and criminal justice + 40 members
- 19. United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime : Annual Report on World Drug Day + World
  Wildlife Crime Report 2024
- Most Affected Regions = Triple Frontier Area: Argentina, Brazil, and Paraguay.
- Golden Triangle (renamed as Death Triangle): Laos, Myanmar, and Thailand.
- · Golden Cresent (renamed as Death Crescent): Afghanistan, Pakistan and Iran.
- HQ = Vienna + all UN members.
- 20. News → International Narcotics Control Board : Jagjit Pavadia has been re-elected for a third term to INCB.
- Estb = 1968 : independent + quasi-judicial body responsible for monitoring the implementation of the United Nations international drug control conventions.
- 13 members elected by the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC).
- 21. News → United Nations Counter-Terrorism Trust Fund : India recently donated \$500,000.
- Established in 2009 and integrated into the UN Office of Counter-Terrorism (UNOCT) in 2017.
- Provides a framework for addressing evolving challenges related to global terrorism through international cooperation and capacity building in vulnerable regions.
- India's recent financial contribution is specifically aimed at:
  - Countering Financing of Terrorism (CFT)
  - Countering Terrorist Travel Programme (CTTP)



- 22. News → United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP) report : Asia-Pacific region is projected to miss the 2030 target for achieving the
   17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 32 years.
- UNESCAP = is one of the five regional commissions of the United Nations.
- Aim = promote cooperation among countries for economic and social development.
- HQ = Bangkok, Thailand: 53 member States and 9 associate members.
- 23. News -> Africa Club: launched during 37th African Union Summit: Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.
- alliance of African Multilateral Financial Institutions that are African-owned and controlled.
- To enhance Africa's influence in the global financial system by aligning its operations with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the African Union's Agenda 2063.
- AU = intergovernmental organization : 55 member states from Africa.
- · Successor to the Organisation of African Unity (OAU) established in 1963.
- Aim: To build an Integrated, Prosperous, and Peaceful Africa, driven by its own citizens.
