GSAP - Goal

The goal of the ForumIAS 2025 GSAP Program is to a) aid students in building rich and fresh content covering the entire syllabus, b) fine tuning answer writing skills and c) consolidating one's preparation through note making for the Civil Services Mains Examination.

This, we plan to achieve, by **regular test taking, answer writing practise** and **notes making in a focused classroom environment,** aided by a mentor based monitoring for the entire life cycle of the program.

Structure and Deliverables of GSAP:

GSAP will cover static syllabus for GS Paper 1, 2 and 3 for Mains examination 2025. The classes will be held 4 - 5 days in a week. Duration of each class will be 3.5 hours. The timing of the class will be from 10:30 AM to 02:00 PM. We will be doing around 45 classes in total. The course will be completed by 09th August 2025.

The different deliverables under GSAP will be:

- a) Content Building Classes: These will ensure complete coverage of relevant static content for GS papers. The curriculum of the class has been curated such that you understand the locus as well as outer boundary of content required to be prepared.
- b) **Daily Assignments:** For GSAP Mains 2025, we have aligned Daily Assignment for furthering the opportunities to fine tune your answer writing skills. The daily assignments will be conducted before each class on the topics covered in previous classes.

Why GSAP?

It's common for many students, to crack the Prelims again and again but the mains exam become a roadblock for them. They are stuck at either Mains stage or they reach interview with very less marks in mains which finally affect their standing in merit list. While mentor helps them with presentation and structure of answer writing, relevant content for answer writing is missing. This is primarily because of:

- **#1 Fragmented preparation:** preparing without plan; focussing mostly on topics being covered in online websites or being asked in test series/ answer writing initiatives; underestimate or overestimate the syllabus of UPSC CSE and have a false notion.
- #2 Lack of consolidation: students who have attended foundation few years back has failed to update their notes and reading in line with recent trend of UPSC; most of the foundation courses offer very basic understanding of the subject and often limit themselves to factual information in their course structure; too much of fact gathering.
- **#3 Gaping holes in preparation:** failure to prepare for value added topics; lack of notes and reading material on topics which don't have concrete sources in a book
- #4 Candidates with high number of attempts (2+), usually face problems: no longer have the same level of energy, motivation, or peer group to study; they have studied something of everything, but full of nothing, so reading the same books/ taking same classes irritates them; they do not make new notes at all, and are stuck with notes which are 2 3 years old when they first stated preparation; they have reached a knowledge plateau with each passing day, they learn nothing new.
- **#5 Misguidance:** a lot of student tend to copy toppers or their peer strategies without giving a thought of what actually works for them; a lot of guidance from peers and others are clouded in their own experiences and not on the specific issues being faced by you.

c) **Mentorship:** Throughout the program you will have a dedicated mentor assigned to you; who will help you to incrementally increases your answer writing skills and track your progress.

GSAP can be taken in conjunction with Current Affairs+ for Mains 2025 and Ethics + for Mains 2025 for 360 degree preparation for all four (4) GS Papers. The GSAP has been planned such that classes will not be clashing with the classes of CA for mains or Ethics.

** GSAP classes will not cover factual information. The program is not recommended for freshers or aspirants who have not completed basic reading of all subjects. GSAP classes are not an alternative to GS Foundation classes.
