Unification of Italy was influenced by the wave of nationalism in Europe, which led to the struggle for unity.

Italy was called a prison of geographical expression by the leaders of Congress of Vienna and divided into smaller units/states.

Unification of Italy has following events:-

① Establishment of radical and revolutionary group.

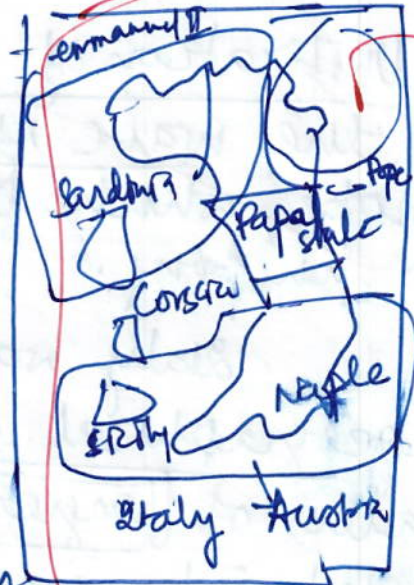
② Young Italy by the Mazzini laid down basic philosophy of unified Italy.

③ King Emmanuel II appointed Cavour as Prime Minister of Sardinia and predominant for unification.

④ Garibaldi fought the battle for unification of Italy & Sicily and Naples won.

## Event in the unification of Italy :-

- ① Italy forged alliance with Russia and defeated Austria - Lombardy became part of Italy
- ② Treaty of Neutrality with Russia → Russia won Venetia and gifted to Italy
- ③ Gariibaldi won fought against Sardinia and Naples - part of Italy
- ④ Papal state - not by refused by Cavour pretext of law & order - Pope signed treaty & left to Neutrality to proscribe and part of Italy.



## Role played by Cavour

- ① Cavour became PM of Sardinia & Piedmont through Emmanuel II
- ② He was a rational being and observed the difficulty in unification. Thus through economic reforms and diplomacy - started unifying



- ① Economic reforms: built road,  
railways, connectivity, influence  
of church decreased
- ② Diplomacy: forged alliance w/

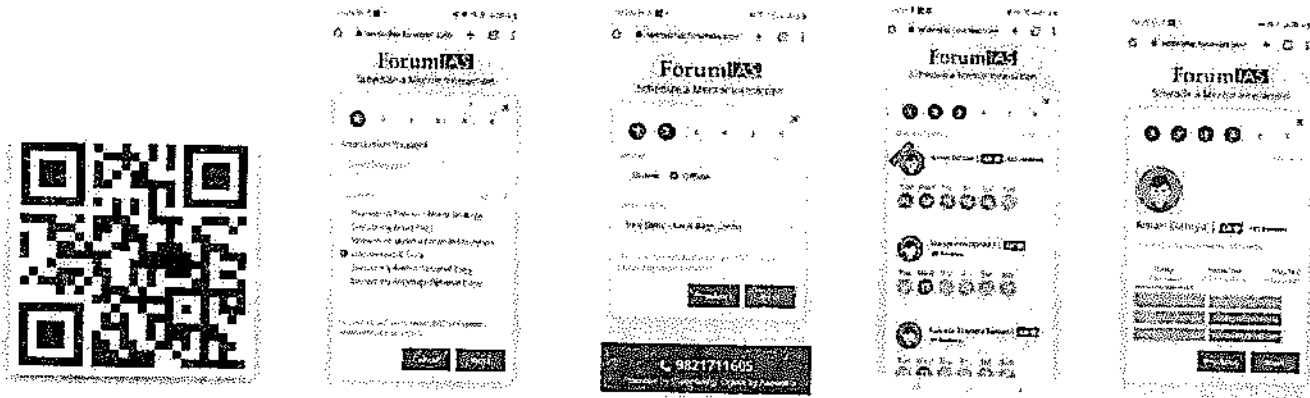
