### How to approach 1st Paper? Which are the areas one must focus on?

- Students should know the distribution of questions asked in Section-A and Section-B as this is helpful even for Paper-II.
- Section-A and Section-B comprises 4 Questions each out of which a student has to attempt 5 Questions in total.
- Question 1 from Section-A and Question 5 from Section-B are compulsory which accounts for 50 marks each respectively. From the remaining, students have to attempt 3 Questions choosing at least 1 question from each section. (This is applicable even for Paper-II)

- This distribution suggests that it is difficult to leave any topic from either of the three subjects as Question No.1 and 5 comprising 100 marks is to be attempted.

### How to approach the 2nd Paper? Which are the areas one must focus on?

- Here too, Question No. 1 and 5 are compulsory too. So, students should prepare Law of Crimes, Law of Torts and Contract properly. However, other topics should also be prepared based on PYQs.
- So, students can choose to write 3 Questions from Section-A and two questions from Section-B in case they are not aware about some of the topics on which questions have been asked in Section-B. This can be one of such strategy but not the only approach.
