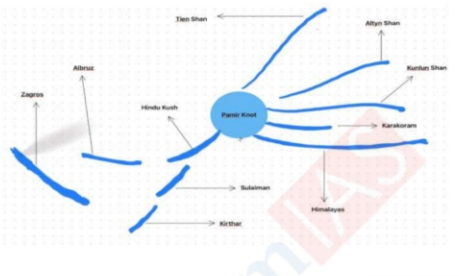

Volcanic Mountains

S.No	Volcanic Mountain	Country / Location	Status	Important Fact
1	Mt. Etna	Italy (Sicily)	Active — erupted multiple times in 2025; ongoing 2026	Europe's tallest and most active volcano (3,357 m); erupting nearly continuously for decades.
2	Mt. Vesuvius	Italy (near Naples)	Active but dormant since 1944	Buried Pompeii in 79 AD; over 3 million people live within its hazard zone today.
3	Mt. Kilimanjaro	Tanzania	Dormant (last eruption ~360,000 years ago)	Highest peak in Africa (5,895 m); world's tallest free-standing mountain.
4	Mt. Fuji	Japan	Active but dormant since 1707	Japan's highest peak (3,776 m) and a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
5	Mauna Loa	USA (Hawaii)	Active — last major eruption 2022	World's largest volcano by volume; rises 13,679 m from the ocean floor.
6	Stromboli	Italy (Aeolian Islands)	Continuously active since 1934 — ongoing 2025–2026	Called the 'Lighthouse of the Mediterranean'; erupts almost every few minutes.
7	Mt. Pinatubo	Philippines (Luzon)	Active (last major eruption 1991)	1991 eruption was 2nd largest of the 20th century; lowered global temperatures by 0.5°C.
8	Cotopaxi	Ecuador	Active — last significant eruption 2015	World's highest active volcano at 5,897 m; glacier-capped stratovolcano.

Great Victoria	South & Western Australia	Hot / Subtropical	Largest desert in Australia at ~424,000 km ² ; named by Ernest Giles during his 1875 crossing.	Contains 100+ dry salt lakes; homeland of Pitjantjatjara and Yankunytjatjara Aboriginal peoples.
Sturt Stony (Stuart)	Central-eastern Australia (NSW, SA, QLD)	Hot / Subtropical	Covered by gibber plains — vast pavements of polished, wind-eroded silcrete pebbles.	Named after explorer Charles Sturt, who nearly died crossing it in 1844-46.
Gibson	Western Australia	Hot / Subtropical	Named after Alfred Gibson, who perished in the desert in 1874 during Giles's expedition.	Characterised by red sandy plains and spinifex grassland; ~200–250 mm of rain per year.
Dasht-e Kavir	North-central Iran (Iranian Plateau)	Hot / Subtropical	Iran's largest desert (~77,000 km ²); thick salt crust concealing treacherous muddy quicksand below.	Summer temperatures exceed 50 °C; surface almost completely devoid of vegetation.
Dasht-e Lut	South-eastern Iran	Hot / Subtropical	World's hottest recorded land surface temperature — 70.7 °C measured by NASA satellite in 2005.	Contains dramatic yardang formations (the 'Kaluts') sculpted by wind erosion, rising up to 200 m.
Ar-Rub' al-Khali (Empty Quarter)	Saudi Arabia, Yemen, Oman & UAE	Hot / Subtropical	Largest continuous sand desert on Earth (~650,000 km ²); dunes reach 250 m — the size of France.	Beneath its sands lie some of the world's largest oil fields; first crossed by a Westerner in 1931.
An-Nafud	Northern Saudi Arabia	Hot / Subtropical	Known for crescent-shaped red sand dunes (barchans) up to 100 m high — reddish hue from iron oxide.	Historically formed a natural barrier shaping ancient Arabian trade routes and tribal migrations.
